MÖSLI, MÖSLI! Paul's letter to his "Group of '49ers"

Written by Paul Rutgers van der Loeff, to friends who were with him in the first Young Leaders International (YLI, later to become LPC) camp, in Switzerland in 1949:



his morning I realized that today is August 1. Natalie Luethi-Peterson taught me 72 years ago that this date in Switzerland is the 'Schweitzer National Feiertag'. At our camp in Mösli we walked with the whole international YLI group of 24 kids and 5 leaders to the edge of the Uetliberg, from where we could admire the festive fireworks over the Zürcher See.

During the last decades my friend Andreas told me several times that after the misery that he experienced in Germany during the Second World War, this was the first time in his life that he understood that fireworks could also be festive.

Of course during our walk in August 1st 1949 it was evening, and because Natalie was afraid that we might get lost in the dark forest, she had taught us that if we feared to get lost, we should call for help by shouting "Mösli, Mösli" in order to get 'home' again.



Since that time we witnessed that with much pain and effort Europe was able to get back on its feet. But we have also learned that the world has become smaller and smaller and that all countries have become increasingly dependent on each other. The international perspective that Natalie taught us has also clarified how important it is for those that come after us to treat the earth, our only home, with care and respect.

Almost daily we now hear and see how massive forest fires threaten the lives of people and animals - in Southern Europe, Siberia, the west coast of Canada and the USA, the Amazon forest, Australia.

With these kinds of desperate images I feel the urge to call "Mösli, Mösli!" again, so we can support each other and not get lost.
